



**Title:** Delaware Watershed Fellowship Dock Hand

**Hours:** 12 week internship from June to August 2017

**Description:** The Delaware Watershed Fellow will be a part of our Dock Hand team. Dock Hands are responsible for ensuring that proper safety protocol and visitor assistance is provided during waterfront programming, including public small boat rentals, special events, and summer camp.

**Qualifications:**

- Experience with rowing, small boats, and kayaks required
- Previous experience working on boat docks preferred
- Small boat certification and Lifesaving certification a plus
- Basic computer skills
- Good interpersonal communication & flexibility
- Ability to represent the Museum to potential visitors
- Ability to work long hours outdoors in the summer weather and to stand for long periods of time
- Patience and attention to detail
- PA Child Abuse History Clearance required

**Duties:**

- Handle customer sales of boat rental program; safely assist customers into and out of boats; calmly handle situations on the water
- Assist with dockside related programming and events
- Observe and enforce proper safety standards during boat rental and summer camp hours
- Prepare boats for usage and end-of-day storage by pumping water out of boats, cleaning boats, and ensuring boats are tied off properly
- Assist if needed with construction, restoration, maintenance, and repair of wooden boats, fiberglass boats, and kayaks
- Perform routine maintenance on docks
- Welcome visiting ships and other boats on the dock and the landing, and assist with their docking and other needs
- Perform other duties as assigned
